- Certificate in Youth Ministry (0.5 year)
- Diploma in Theology (1 year)
- Bachelor of Theology (3 years)
- Graduate Certificate in Theology
 - Youth & Campus Ministry (0.5 year)
- Master of Theology – Pastoral Ministry (1 year)

These offerings provide emerging and experienced youth and campus ministers excellent opportunities to develop their skills. From 2010, BBI will offer revised Youth Ministry units in online mode:

THEO1011 **Introduction to Youth Ministry**

THEO6021 **Youth Ministry – Foundations**

This introductory unit offers current findings on Generations Y and Z, stages of faith, youth ministry models and ways to engage young people. The component is practical, based on one's youth ministry and the challenges and promises it holds.

THEO2024 **Specialised Youth Ministry 1**

THEO6022 **Advanced Studies in Youth Evangelisation and Christian Formation**

This second unit is based upon the 'Anointed and Sent: An Australian Vision for Catholic Youth Ministry' document ratified by the Australian Catholic Bishop in 2009. The unit provides a comprehensive Australian vision of youth ministry in all its dimensions.
