About the Course

The eight-session course will:

- be based on the principles of adult learning and best practice online pedagogy;
- incorporate multi-media content from experts around Australia;
- integrate ethical principles via case studies and the day-to-day experience of participants;
- support ethical practice in both the clinical and wider organisational environment;
- · foster reflective practice;
- require approximately two hours per session to complete (around 16 hours total);
- be uploaded fortnightly over a four month period;
- offer access to feedback and group learning via a tutor and online learning community.

I am looking forward to working with you in *Decoding the Code*. I have both a very practical interest and a theoretical interest in the Code of Ethical Standards for Catholic Health and Aged Care in

Australia. On the practical level, for the past few years I have been in a leadership role at Catholic Health Australia, the peak body supporting the Catholic health, aged care, and community sector. I have been part of the mission services team. With that role comes support to our members in implementing the Code and coordinating some training in aspects of it, most recently concerning our response to physician assisted suicide and euthanasia. I have also had to use the Code in writing submissions to government on various medical procures and research in medicine and presenting the perspective of our sector. In my work I have lots of regular contact with Catholic health and aged care services that adds an applied dimension to my understanding of the Code.

On a theoretical level, I am a theologian, and I am very interested in the intersection of ethics and the public sphere. How do we engage in a wider public discourse about ethical issues concerning health and aged care that opens space for dialogue in our society and workplaces with a rich tradition of ethical thinking informed by faith and reason in a way that includes those outside a faith community?
