

REDU802 RELIGIOUS EDUCATION SYMPOSIUM



UNIT OVERVIEW AND CONTENT

Enroll in REDU802, an independent directed study that is based on participation in the symposium. This unit builds up your understanding of religious education with pre and post symposium readings as well as offering the opportunity to experience and engage with keynote and symposium workshops at greater depth.

This unit provides students with the opportunity to review religious education in relationship to the goals of Catholic education. It draws on students' participation in the National Religious Education symposium as a catalyst for exploring how the practice of religious education is impacted upon, and can be improved, by critical reflection on key issues that impact upon this discipline.

STUDY HOURS

10 hours per week for 12 weeks in Trimester 3, 2023, comprised of:

- Active participation in the 2 day Religious Education Symposium (12 hours)
- Minimum of three hours per week of reading
- Minimum of six hours per week of directed study, including optional and assessable online activities.

TEACHING METHODS

Key notes and workshops at the National Religious Education Symposium; online activities; guided reading; scaffolded assessments; feedback on assessments.

TYPE OF ASSESSMENT AND WEIGHT

Discussion Forum (30%) Major Essay (40%) PowerPoint Presentation (30%)
